<u>Dr Jonathan Brett</u> - nominated by the Australasian Society of Clinical and Experimental Pharmacologists and Toxicologists (ASCEPT).

Dr Jonathan Brett is a senior staff specialist in clinical pharmacology, toxicology, and addiction medicine at St. Vincent's Hospital, Sydney, and a clinical toxicologist with the NSW Poisons Centre. He serves as a conjoint Associate Professor at St. Vincent's Clinical School and a Senior Research Fellow with the Medicines and Health Intelligence Unit at UNSW's School of Population Health. His research focuses on neuropsychopharmacology, drugs of abuse, and medication use in pregnancy.
